TELL John 1:43-51

Did you ever participate in "show and tell" in school, or some version of it? You brought in something important to you, or something that helped people know something about you, showed it to the class, and then shared what it was about. Most kids are really excited for "show and tell" opportunities. Telling people about what brings us joy, or what makes us who we are, is natural and fun. So what might it look like to show and tell others about Jesus?

Monday: Read John 1:29-31.

What does it mean to you personally that Jesus takes away sin? What words would you use to describe who Jesus is to someone who doesn't know Him? *Practice Step:*

Write down what it means to you that Jesus forgives sin and loves without condition. Bring to mind one person who may need to hear this truth about Jesus. Practice sharing it in simple terms with a trusted friend or family member.

Tuesday: Read John 1:32-34.

What are moments in your life where you've clearly seen God at work? How can you use those experiences to encourage others to trust in God? *Practice Step:*

Think of one specific way Jesus has shown His power or love in your life. Share this moment with someone this week, focusing on how it brought you peace, joy, or hope.

Wednesday: Read John 1:35-39.

What spiritual questions or longings do people around you have? How can you gently ask questions that help them express what they're seeking in life or faith? *Practice Step:*

Practice having a deeper conversation with someone this week. Start with questions like, "What do you think gives life meaning?" or "What brings you hope?"

Thursday: Read John 1:40-42.

Like Andrew, you don't have to know everything about faith to share an invitation to know Jesus. What simple truths about Jesus could you share with others today? *Practice Step:*

Write a short description of who Jesus is to you. Complete this sentence: "I've found ________through knowing Jesus." Now practice sharing it in simple terms with a trusted friend or family member.

Friday: Read John 1:43-45.

Why should we be excited about sharing the invitation to know Jesus? What do you wish everyone knew about Jesus? *Practice Step:* Think of one person who might be open to hearing about Jesus. Pray for him or her to be

open to conversation. Pray for the Holy Spirit to create an opportunity for you to share.

Saturday: Read John 1:46-51

What misperceptions do you think people have about Jesus?

How can Philip's simple invitation, "Come and see," shape the way you share your faith? *Practice Step*

Identify one practical way to show Christ's love this week—through an act of kindness, forgiveness, or generosity. When someone notices, point to Jesus as the reason for your actions.

Why is it so hard to tell others about Jesus? Perhaps it's because of how the church is perceived today, or how people react when we bring up Jesus. Yet the truth is such a gift. Christianity is not primarily about how bad we have been, but about how good Jesus is. We witness to this beautiful truth that God loves us despite our faults. This is our story. After Jesus invites Philip to follow him, Philip goes to tell his friend Nathanael. When Nathanael hesitates, Philip offers a simple invitation: Come and see!

You're invited to experience the joy of telling others the truth about Jesus!
